## McDowell Foundation 10th Anniversary Event

VEG Remarks to introduce speakers/program:

I am very happy to welcome you all to this celebration of the 10th year of the Barbara McDowell Foundation and in particular its partnership with Drinker Biddle & Reath. In particular, I want to welcome, Judge Patricia Millett of the DC Cir Court of Appeals, other members of the federal and local District of Columbia bench, former and current members of the Solicitor General's office and all those who worked with or knew Barbara McDowell.

I am the Chair of Drinker's Public Interest Committee and want to express the Firm's continuing commitment to the high impact litigation that is central to the McDowell Foundation's mission. 10 yrs ago Jerry Hartman, then a senior partner, proposed a program to honor the legacy of his late wife, Barbara McDowell. As many of you know, Barbara was committed to promoting social and economic justice through the courts.
